

A new parking lot at the foot of Maple Avenue South offers a grand view of the harbour and Strait of Juan de Fuca.

The District of Sooke developed the 210 x 80 meter parking area to free up the roadside along West Coast Road for safer pedestrian and cycling traffic near the Prestige Oceanfront Resort. About 12 to 15 trucks and trailers can be accommodated (size dependent). West Shore

The fishing-season proliferation of larger vehicles and boat trailers as well as vehicles of visitors who attend large-scale events at the hotel have been causing a safety hazard along the south side of the 6900-block stretch of West Coast Road where there is no sidewalk. Parking on West Coast Road will be prohibited in this area and those who park on West Coast Road near the public boat launch will be subject to towing, says the District of Sooke.

This is an effort toward a long-awaited solution to the shortage of parking for the Sooke public boat launch at the foot of the Prestige hotel driveway. The hotel was completed in June 2011 and the boat launch officially opened in July 2012. "We are pleased to be in a position to address this public safety issue," says Mayor Maja Tait. The owner of the property is Brian Butler, who was "pleased to accommodate the District's request". West Shore

There is a 1.5-meter wide off-road 212-meter grave walkway from the lot to a spot 100-meters short of the boat launch access road (aka hotel drive-

So far, dawn-to-dusk parking is available without a fee. Overnight camping or any lengthy stays are not allowed. "This is an effort to provide fair and equitable access for everyone," says the District of Sooke. wsv

As of Friday afternoon

June 17, the main suspect in a driveby shooting in Sooke on June 14 was still on the loose, and was being tracked in the Thetis Lake area by West Shore RCMP.

After the mid-evening June 14 shooting on the relatively isolated Ella Road in Sooke, three suspects got away in a car with Saskatchewan plates that had been stolen from the Langford area.

One of the suspects wasvoice News taken into custody on June 15 in Langford (name being withheld by RCMP), but the main suspect Josh LaFleur, age 25, is still sought.

The shooting that was called in by an area-resident around 9:20 pm on Tuesday evening caused injuries to two young men (in their 20's) from the Sooke area. One with an injury to his arm was released fairly quickly. The other with injuries directly to his chest has remained in hospital.

Six-foot-tall shooting suspect Josh LaFleur, 25, is still being sought by police, following his involvement in a shooting on Ella Road in Sooke on Tuesday evening, June 14.

A Sooke firefighter went with the seriously injured man by ambulance to Victoria General Hospital, says Sooke Fire Chief Steve Sorensen. Six firefighter rescue personnel attended at the shooting scene.

LaFleur, the suspected shooter, is "still outstanding and should be considered armed and dangerous," said Sooke RCMP Detachment Commander Jeff McArthur on Thursday, June 16. RCMP says anyone with tips on the case or who sees LaFleur to call 911 or Sooke RCMP at 250-642-5241 but to not approach the suspect. wsv

Breach of privacy at Island Health WEST SHORE VOICE NEWS

Island Health uncovered the breach of 198 patient records during one of their routine pro-active audits of employee access to the Electronic Health Record, it was explained in a news conference on June 14.

The breach occured as an unauthorized viewing of patient records by two Island Health non-clinical support staff. Once the breach was discovered, quality assurance staff went back 16 months in the files; one employee had been with the regional health authority since 2012, the other since 2013. Both are no longer with Island Health which employees over 18,000 people, loice News

The accessed records were those of family, friends, co-workers and "public celebrities", said Kathy MacNeil, Executive VP of Quality, Safety & Experience, Island Health, on Tuesday. MacNeil said that -- as of this week -- most but not all of the impacted persons had been notified. So far the contact has been attempted by phone and/or letter. All of the breached files were of persons who either live on Vancouver Island or have visited here. wsv



But families are often not recognized enough for their contributions. The long nights taking care of kids when they're sick, the meetings missed or trips not taken because the needs

of a child took priority, the missed or postponed financial and Nest Shor career opportunities. Many families have declined in their well-being and net worth due to the increasing cost of everything since about 2001 -- especially in BC where the government's longstanding privatization exercise has stripped away any meaningful middle class momentum. Many average Canadian families carry scorching-hot debt levels that make national news. West shore

Parents do grow and deepen emotionally and spiritually by the experiences and challenges of raising a family. But our society has almost no means of recognition of families who -- at the bare bones of it -- are raising future workers for the tax-collecting state. The better the job we do as parents, the better off society will be. Good parents know this, but also know that loved and cared-for human beings are the ones who will fare the best. Add a good education on top of that, and you've got new young adults with a fighting chance.

The burden will shift from families to a suitable degree in some blurry distant future when Canada eventually adopts the Scandanavian and French model of government-funded education and family salary support (beyond



simplistic El maternity leave). In the USA this year we saw an inkling of that hope in the campaign of Democratic candidate Bernie Sanders (and hopefully presumptive presidential nominee Hillary Clinton adopts some of that). In Canada we hope the 'middle class cause' of the renewed Liberals can work toward these goals as well.

Parents often sacrifice much to hold their children above water in an imperfect world. Our culture needs more than a grad ceremony to recognize the effort and commitment that parents, extended families and other caregivers have made toward furthering a healthy society by doing everything it takes to maintain a healthy family and raise good kids.

 Sooke Council provided preliminary input to a discussion about 'a framework for Capital Integrated Services and Governance Initiative', conducted during Committee of the Whole by consultants George Abbott and Dale Wall of Circle Square Solutions. 



If your summer vacation plans include a road trip, the last thing you want is to have unexpected car trouble to leave you stranded at the side of the road, ruining all the fun.

A pre-trip vehicle check is the best way to be car-care-aware and ensure that your car is ready to get you to your destination, says the Great Canadian Oil Change.

- Check filters and fluids, including engine oil, power steering and brake and transmission, as well as windshield washer fluid and antifreeze/ coolant. Dirty air filters can waste gas and cause the engine to lose power.
- Check the **hoses and belts** that can become cracked, brittle, frayed, loose or show signs of excessive wear. These are critical to the proper functioning of the electrical system, air conditioning, power steering and the cooling system.
- Check the brake system and make sure the battery connection is clean, tight and corrosion-free.
- Check the tires, including tire pressure and tread. Underinflated tires reduce a vehicle's fuel economy and uneven wear indicates a need for wheel alignment. Tires should also be checked for bulges and bald spots.
- Check that the gas cap is not damaged, loose or missing to prevent gas from spilling or evaporating. WSV
